EUROPEAN UNION OF THE DEAF YOUTH (EUDY)

The European Union of the Deaf Youth is a European non-profit organisation whose membership comprises of the Youth National Associations of the Deaf and Youth Sections of National Associations of Deaf people in Europe. Established in 1987, EUDY is the only organisation representing the interests of Deaf Young Europeans in Europe. Currently, EUDY has 28 Full members, from Iceland to Romania, and from Spain to Finland. EUDY strives to foster the personal development of young deaf persons with a sign language in Europe and to further mutual understanding to advance and protect the rights of and opportunities for young deaf Europeans.

ÅL FÖLKEHØYSKOLE OG KURSSENTER FOR DØVE

The Ål Folkehøyskole og Kurscenter for døve (Ål Folk High School and Course Center for the Deaf), located in central Norway, is an educational centre for Deaf persons in Norway and beyond. The Ål Folkehøyskole is specialised in courses that are provided in Norwegian Sign Language. There are different trainings for parents of Deaf children and for Deaf young persons from Norway as well as different international cooperating projects, such as the hosting of youth exchanges in cooperation with the European Union of the Deaf Youth (EUDY).

EUROPEAN YOUTH FOUNDATION

EUDY Junior Camp 2016 is funded as an International Activity by the European Youth Foundation (EYF). The European Youth Foundation is a fund established in 1972 by the Council of Europe to provide financial and educational support for European youth activities. It is a division in the Youth Department of the Council of Europe's Directorate of Democratic Citizenship and Participation, Directorate General of Democracy.

THE ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME

EUDY Junior Camp 2016 is funded under the Erasmus+ Key Action 1 programme (Youth Exchanges). The Erasmus+ is Europe's biggest grant program for Education, Youth and Sports. With a budget of € 14.000.000.000 for 7 years, there are plenty of opportunities for researchers, students, youth exchanges, trainings, mobility projects, etc.

PARTICIPANTS

Participants must be between 13 and 17 years old, following the birth year. This means a 12-year-old person may participate in the Junior Camp if they are turning 13 in the year of the camp. A person who will be turning 18 years old before 27 July 2016 will not be allowed to participate.

LEADERS

Leaders must be between 21 and 30 years old. Leaders should be fluent in International Sign and have previous experience working at camps and/or working with children. Please refer to the attached document for registration. Contact your Deaf Youth National Association to complete your registration.

THEME AND LOGO



EXPLANATION OF THEME

The EUDY Jr. Camp 2016's theme is "Diversity Among Us". The aim of this camp is to unleash the creative potential of our different cultures and traditions within the Deaf community, and to ensure that these differences enrich and strengthen us, instead of dividing us. The campers will be challenged to explore differences in behaviors, traditions, cultures and norms within the Deaf community, and to analyse the important roles the Deaf communities have in promoting a more diverse world. Awareness and respect of our human rights is essential in creating strong leaders who can work together towards a better world for the Deaf and sign languages. At the conclusion of the EUDY Jr. Camp, all participants will have gained a better understanding of how to integrate their knowledge of the differences in cultures, norms and traditions in the real world.

EXPLANATION OF LOGO

The EUDY Jr. Camp 2016 Logo reflects the theme and location of the camp. The theme "Diversity Among Us" is represented by the colors of the rainbow, and the camp location is represented by a well-known Scandinavian symbol: the Viking helmet with horns, which is surrounded by the EU stars.

LOCATION

Ål Folkehøyskole og kurscenter for døve / Ål Folk High School and Course Center for the Deaf in Ål, Norway.



The EUDY Jr. Camp 2016 will take place from 19-26 July 2016 at Ål Folkehøyskole / Ål Folk High School in Ål, Norway. The school is located on a top of a mountain with breathtaking panoramic views overlooking the town of Ål. The school will provide food and lodging for the entire duration of the camp. There is also a swimming pool and access to outdoor team-building activities on site.

VACCINATIONS

For Norway, there are no required vaccinations. However, it is encouraged to stay current on routine shots (MMR and DPT vaccinations, poliovirus vaccine, Hepatitis A & B, etc).

ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICY

Consumption of alcohol and drugs is absolutely prohibited for the entire duration of the Jr. Camp. Any participant under the age of 18 is NOT permitted to smoke. Also if you have permission from your parents, you cannot smoke. Medicine prescribed by the doctor is allowed if you bring a doctor's note with an explanation. Parental permission is required for bringing or buying over-the-counter medicine.

HEALTH INSURANCE / MEDICAL FORM

Each participant is expected to provide some kind of health coverage for the duration of the camp. Participants will be asked to explain about their medical needs on the registration form. Campers have the freedom not to reveal anything about their medical needs, but EUDY and the Organising Committee will not be responsible in any way should something happen.
